UNIT-VI CONCEPT OF PEACE:

* Peace is a concept of societal friendship and harmony in the absence of hostility and violence.

IMPORTANCE OF PEACE:

* PEACE is important in all levels. For example we need inner peace for our well being but we also need world peace in order to live blissfully. Peace between all religions creates a harmony in all races of people. Peace is commonly used to mean a lack of conflict. One of the main reasons

for the absence of peace is the proliferation of asymmetric relationships. Peace is the way out of inequity and violence and a golden ticket to enter a new, brighter future for human kind.

Zones Of Peace:

* Zone of peace is then defined as a discrete geographical region of the world in which a group of states have maintained peaceful relations among themselves for a period of at least thirty years (generations). The term "Zones of Peace" has been used in reference to the Cold War (1945-1989). Zones of Peace, characterized by the absence of interstate war. Even though civil wars and domestic unrest.

NUCLEAR FREE ZONES :

* Nuclear Free Zone - (Nuclear-weapon-Free-Zone) is a specified region in which countries commit themselves not to manufacture, acquire, test or possess nuclear weapons. And nuclear weapons and nuclear power plants are banned. They typically do not prohibit other nuclear technologies such as Cyclotrons used in particle physics. Several sub national authorities world wide have declared themselves "nuclear-free". Nuclear weapons and components may traverse nuclear-free-zones. New Zealand was the first Western allied nation to legislate towards "national nuclear free" Zone by effectively renouncing the nuclear deterrent.
