Organization of Indian Army:

* The Indian Army is the land based branch and the

largest component of the Indian Armed Forces. President of India is the Supreme Commander of the Indian Army. And its professional head is the Chief of Army Staff (COAS).

The Indian Army originated from the armies of the East India Company.

The Indian Army is operationally and geographically divided into "Seven Commands".

Army headquarters is located in the Indian Capital, "New Delhi".

Indian Army is divided into Seven Command:

- * Eastern Command - Kolkata
- * Central Command - Lucknow
- * Northern Command - Udhampur
- * Southern Command - Pune
- * Southwestern Command - Jaipur
- * Western Command - Chandigarh

* Training Command - Shimla

Organization of Indian Navy - Naval Head
Quarters:

* Indian Navy is the "naval branch" of the Indian Armed Forces. The President of India is the Supreme Commander of the Indian Navy. It is an Part of Indian Armed Forces.

Indian Navy traces its origin back to the East India Company's Marine. On the southern front, the 1st Sovereign of the Maratha Empire, Shivaji Bhosole

Started creating his own fleet. His fleet was commanded by notable admirals like Sidhoji Gujar and Kanhoji Angre.

"Chhatrapati Shivaji Bhosle", Maratha emperor is considered as Father of the Indian Navy. Naval headquarters at New Delhi. There are three commands in Indian Navy.

- * Eastern Naval Command - Vishakapatnam
- * Western Naval Command - Mumbai
- * Southern Naval Command - Kochi

There is also one more Command at the Andaman & Nicobar Island which is a tri-service Command. Navy Day in India is celebrated on 4 December 1971.

Organization of Indian Air Force - Air headquarters.

* The Indian Air Force is the air arm of the Indian Armed Forces. Its primary mission is to secure Indian airspace and to conduct aerial warfare during armed conflict. The rank structure of the Indian Air Force is based on that of the "Royal Air Force." After India gained independence from the United Kingdom in 1947, the name Royal Indian Air Force was kept and serve in the name of Dominion of India. The Indian Air Force, with highly trained crews, pilots and access to modern military assets provides India with the capacity rapid response.

The Indian Air Force was established on "8 Oct 1932." The Indian Air Force is divided into five operational command and two functional command.

- * Central Air Command - Uttar Pradesh
- * Eastern Air Command - Shilong, Meghalaya
- * Southern Air Command - Kerala
- * South Western Air Command - Gujorat
- * Western Air Command - New Delhi.

The headquarters of the IAF is at New Delhi.

Functional Command:

- * Training Command
- * Maintenance Command
