THE WINTER'S TALE

- The scene is laid in the palace of the King of Sicilia, Leontes.
- Leontes, Camillo, a lord of Sicilia and Archidamus, a Lord of Bohemia are engaged in a friendly talk.
- · The King of Bohemia, Polixenes, is on a visit to his friend, Leontes.
- They are cordially received by the Leontes. Leontes and Polixenes have been very intimate old friends.
- They kept in close contact with interchange of gifts and letters.

- Leontes, his Queen Hermione and their youngPrince Mamillius and Polixenes are talking.
- Polixenes says that he has stayed in Sicilia for nine months and he wants to leave next day.
- Leontes persuades him to stay for a week, but Polixenes expresses his inability to stay any longer.
- After listening to the request of the Queen, he agrees to stay for another week.

- It raises jeolousy and suspicion in the mind of Leontes.
- The rage of jeolousy grows 'inch thick, knee-deep, over head and ears'
- He believes that the love of Hermione and Polixenes must have been popular among the people.
- ► He cannot digest the fact that his queen is an adulteress.

- He talks to Camillo in confidence and acquaints him with his conviction that Hermione is an adulteress.
- Camilla makes every possible effort to make Leontes believe that the queen is noble and faithful.
- He is filled with suspicion, jealousy and vengeance.

- > He appoints Camillo to poison Polixenes.
- Camillo finds himself in a hard plight.
- > His conscience does not allow him to poison Polixenes.
- > He confides the treacherous plan to Polixenes.
- > He advises him to leave Sicilia immediately.
- Polixenes expresses his gratitude to Camillo and promises him that he will be respected as a courtier in his kingdom.

- Hermione and Mamillius are playing and the Queen is going to beget a new prince.
- Leontes and his Lords arrive there. Antigonus informs the King that he saw Polixenes and Camillo escape from Sicilia.
- Leontes accuses Hermione of adultery with Polixenes.
- The Queen is filled with astonishment, pain and shame.
- He turns a deaf ear to all the lords, who try to silence him

- The queen is sent to the prison.
- Antigonus and other lords argue with the king in defence of Hermione's purity but fail to move him.
- Leontes informs him Lords that he has already sentCleomenes and Dion to Apollo's temple at Delphosto bring the Oracle on the conduct of the Queen.
- He promises to act in accordance with the instructions given in the Oracle.

- > Paulina, the wife of Antigonus goes to the prison.
- > She is a noble lady faithfully devoted to the queen.
- Emilia informs Paulina that the Queen has delivered a beautiful daughter.
- > She reports that the queen finds comfort in it.
- Paulina proposes to take the child to the king in the hope that the sight of the child may soften him.
- > Emilia delivers the child into the hands of Paulina.

- Leontes is informed that Prince Mamillius has taken the dishonour of his mother deeply.
- ▶ He has lost his appetite and sleep.
- > Paulina enters with the infant daughter in her arms.
- ► Her husband, Antigonus and other lords try to prevent her from entering the king's chamber.
- ➤ She speaks loudly at the king's door.

➤ The king gets annoyed and asks Antigonus to drive away his wife.

- > She asserts that the queen is noble and honourable and that the king is a heartless tyrant.
- > Paulina leaves the infant daughter at the feet of the king.
- The king appoints Antigonus to take the child to its own protection.

Before the queen is recovered from her grief for the loss of her baby, he has brought her to a public trial.

- The unhappy queen is standing as a prisoner before her subjects to receive her judgement.
- Cleomenes and Dion present to the king the answer of the Oracle sealed up.
- Leontes commands the words of the Oracle to be read out aloud. "Hermione is innocent, Polixenes blameless, Camillo a true subject, Leontes a jealous tyrant and the king shall live without an heir if that which is lost be not found."

- The King would give no credit to the words of the Oracle.
- A messenger enters and tells him that Prince Mamillius was struck with grief and shame, had suddenly died.
- > Hermione, hearing the death of her son faints.
- Leontes, pierced to the heart begins to feel pity for his unhappy queen.
- > Paulina tells the king that Hermione is dead.
- > He repents of his cruelty to her, he believes her innocent.
- > Antigonus' ship is driven by a storm upon the coasts of Bohemia and he leaves the child.
- ► He never returned because a bear tore him to pieces.
- > The child was dressed in rich clothes and jewels.

- Antigonus had pinned a paper to its mantle, with the name of Perdita written theron.
- The poor deserted baby is found by a shepherd. He is a kind man and he brings up Perdita as his own child.
- Florizel, the only son of Polixenes sees the old shepherd's supposed daughter, falls in love with her. He, under the name of Doricles becomes constant visitor to the old shepherd's house.

- ▶ Florizel's frequent absence from the court alarm Polixenes.
- ► He discovers his love for the shepherd's daughter.
- Polixenes and Camillo, both in disguise arrive at the old shepherd's house, as they are celebrating the feast of sheep-shearing.
- Polixenes gets angry with Florizel and Perdita and leaves the place.

- The kind-hearted Camillo is charmed with the propriety of Perdita's behaviour. He thinks of a way to befriend the lovers.
- > Camillo knows that Leontes has grown into a true penitent.
- He proposes to Florizel and Perdita that they should go to the Sicilian court.
- The shepherd takes with him Perdita's jewels, her baby clothes, and the paper.
- > Florizel introduces Perdita as his princess.
- Leontes perceives a resemblance between Perdita and his dead queen.
- Polixenes and Camillo arrive in Sicily in pursuit of his son and Perdita.
- ➤ Camillo has a secret plan to join Leontes and Polixenes.
- ➤ The shepherd realises that Perdita as the lost daughter of Leontes.

- Paulina, are present when the old shepherd relates to the king the manner in which he had found the child, and also the circumstances of Antigonus' death.
- The King is struck with great sorrow that Hermione was not living to see Perdita.
- Paulina says that she had a statue of Hermione, newly finished by the Italian master, Julio Romano.
- > Perdita has been admiring the statue of her matchless mother.
- Paulina orders some slow and solemn music. The statue comes down from the pedestal of and throws its arms around Leontes' neck.
- > The statue blesses her husband and Perdita.

- Paulina had falsely reported to the king the death of Hermione.
- > She had forgiven injuries which Leontes had done to herself.
- Congratulations and affectionate speech are heard on all sides.
- > They bless the old shepherd for preserving their child.
- The two royal kings renew their friendship.
- Leontes takes the hands of Camillo and Paulina and joins them.
